Releases

- Last week
 - Normal weekly release
- This week
 - Version 04.30.00
 - This release will be production for DUNE 35t MCC 5.0
 - New libwda:
 - Now defines LIBWDA_INC
 - New nutools:
 - Changes to IFDatabase for DUNE

Changes to OSX builds

- The ifdhc product is now available on OSX (v1.8.7)
 - Can in principle use ifdh on OSX
 - See <https://cdcvs.fnal.gov/redmine/projects/ifdhc/wiki/SuportedPlatforms>
 - HOWEVER:
 - Need to have OSG client installed in order to use ifchc to transfer files
 - True for both Linux and OSX
 - There is no Mac OSX version, but there is (we believe) a work-around (Marc Mengel)
 - ifdh_platform_pkgs product
 - A binary-only install of 3rd party software
 - Installed on cvmfs, /grid/fermiapp, but need to install using upd for purely local releases
 - This solution is still in testing
 - Bottom line:
 - We will no longer build LArSoft with noifdh qualifier
 - A work-around for using ifdh under OSX is being tested
 - Will distribute instructions for using it when that is completed

A comment on editors and newlines, and other cosmetic changes

- Editors and newlines

- There are varying conventions for newlines
 - Under Unix, the newline is the LF character (`\n`, `0x0A`)
 - Unicode, `http`, many other standards require CR+LF (`\r\n`, `0x0D0A`)
- Most editors are tolerant of what is there.
 - Some will add `\r` to the end of every line of an existing file - **this is BAD behavior**
If you diff such a file after committing it, every line shows up

Please set your editors to leave existing LF's alone

- More generally, if you want to make cosmetic changes to a file (and we encourage making files easier to read...)

- Isolate the cosmetic changes to a commit:
 - Make a commit with ONLY the cosmetic changes
 - Then and only then make substantive changes

Otherwise, it is impossible to tell what changed
