Hi,

Marc, Lynn and I met to collate some results from the OS preference survey. Here are my notes from that meeting. Please send corrections, clarifications, etc.

Present: Marc Paterno, Lynn Garren, Erica snider

The questions we want to answer:

- Respondents: 47
- N users vs developers
 - developers = 38, users = 9
- N laptop developers vs not
 - Yes = 34, No = 13
 - Among those who develop on laptops, how many would prefer something other than what is currently supported: 24 of 34. The breakdown:
 - El Capitan = 4
 - "OSX" unspecified = 1
 - Fedora = 5
 - Linux mint variants = 2
 - Debian = 1
 - Ubuntu LTS (v 14 or 16) = 6
 - Ubuntu current = 2
 - Ubuntu "unspecified" = 3
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 - Total of 24 who would rather be using something else. (10 provided no answer)
 - Of these 24, 14 would use Ubuntu LTS if supported
 - How many of the 34 appear to be "developing" on something that is not supported?
12:
 - Fedora = 2
 - Linux mint = 2
 - OSX *and* ubuntu = 1
 - El Capitan = 3
 - Ubuntu current = 4
 - Among the 13 who are not developing on laptops now, how many would if their OS were supported: 12.
 - The 1 lone person who would not use their laptop is running OS X yosemite. Would prefer to use El Capitan

The breakdown for this 13:

- No specified system but selected "yes" under "I would use Ubuntu LTS if available"
= 7

- Total who would be satisfied with Ubuntu LTS = 9 yes, 4 no
 - This group includes the 7 above, plus two more who wrote in Ubuntu LTS as their preferred system
- Would develop on laptop if their system were supported, but did not indicate what their system is and did not respond to “would use Ubuntu LTS” = 2
- Arch Linux = 1
- Gentoo Linux = 1
- Yosemite = 1
- El Capitan = 1
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- Total from all respondents who would use Ubuntu LTS for development if offered.
 - 24 no, 23 yes
 - This is the bottom line
