

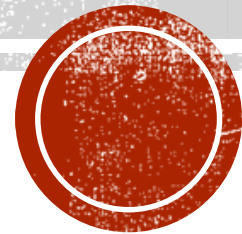

MEETING ETIQUETTE & GUIDELINES

- 1. Be positive and respectful of others**
 - a. Try not to judge or point fingers
- 2. Raise hands:** Raise your hand to speak and wait your turn
 - a. Facilitates “**share the air**”
If you’re dominating discussion, let others participate. If you haven’t said much, you’re encouraged to participate more
- 3. Lean into your discomfort**
 - a. Makes it possible for trust to grow quickly. Many discussions require us to examine issues we don’t want to talk about. Lean into them to make progress.
- 4. Respect the preferred pronouns of others**
- 5. Speak to your own experiences**
 - a. Using “I” or “we” helps avoid generalizations
- 6. Be aware of power dynamics in the room**
- 7. Address any concerns about the discussion or the meeting with the Chairperson**

VOTING PROCESS

- For voting to proceed a quorum is required: 51%
 - This is NOT policy, but in the absence of such I'm just going with what is considered standard (consider actual bylaw) – this number includes any votes that have been sent or proxies assigned.
- Present policy, 20 minutes discussion (after 1 week of comment period)
- The discussion period is brought to a close with a motion that includes the precise wording of the policy that will be voted on, followed with a second.
- Voting will be anonymous on a slip of paper for those in the room via email for those connected remotely via proxy for those who cannot attend and who arranged for a proxy, with emailed notification to the chair, in advance of the meeting
- The tally will be done by an administrator (thank you, Kim) who works with the UEC
- A minimum of 2/3rds of voting members is required for a policy to be adopted
