## On the last episode of CEF (i.e. Panel 2):

#### **Major Goals**


 It is critical that we all agree on the importance of everyone working together to organize and develop our ongoing efforts in CE in a coherent manner focused on improving our HEP community and achieving the vision for our field

• A structure must be established within HEP for taking ownership and responsibility for implementing CEF

recommendations and *monitoring* their progress across the entire field

#### Structural Change

- All stakeholders form a P5-equivalent panel to shepherd CEF recommendations
  - Must have direct connection to multiple streams of resources
  - As opposed to P5: agencies fund/implement projects, so P5 lives within DOE/NSF
- Review CEF integration in Snowmass
  - Perhaps do major work on field-wide CEF planning asynchronously, enhance participation
  - Other Frontiers could still report on CEF activities during Snowmass






## Framework Ideas for Implementation & Monitoring

#### The other Frontiers/Experiments have P5

• All the funding comes through the agencies, so the advisory panel for implementation lives only there

#### **CEF Needs Something Different, Broader**

- We have resource needs too! (tiny compared to you, but still...)
  - o Some will come from agencies, but a lot of it can't
- Multiple funding resources means multiple implementation stakeholders
- 5 Target Communities for Engagement
  - HEP: DPF (\$) is most representative of the entire field, they may be best shepherds of HEP recs
  - o **Industry:** partnership of **agencies** (\$\$\$), **labs** (\$\$), **univ.** (\$?) since that's where relationships with industry are formed.
  - Education: URA (\$) membership is univ. administrations, roles connecting academia with labs
  - Policy: users groups ( ) core to any new policy-focused entity
  - O Society: labs (\$\$) are historical focal points for HEP public engagement
- DPF could oversee/lead this group, i.e. "CEF Small Project"






## **Example "Sub-Projects"**

#### Specific areas in need of targeted support

- Staffing for the group tasked with implementation and monitoring
  - Researcher (surveys, other information gathering)
  - Legal/policy person (lots of recs deal with policy changes)
  - o IT/resource manager/developer
  - Administration (a LOT of communication with HEP community)
- Contracting with external professionals
  - DEI experts
  - Survey professionals
  - 0 ..
- CAD tools licensing package
- <u>All</u> CEF recommendations together might add up to just <u>one</u> Small-scale experiment project (i.e. <\$75M)!</li>
