



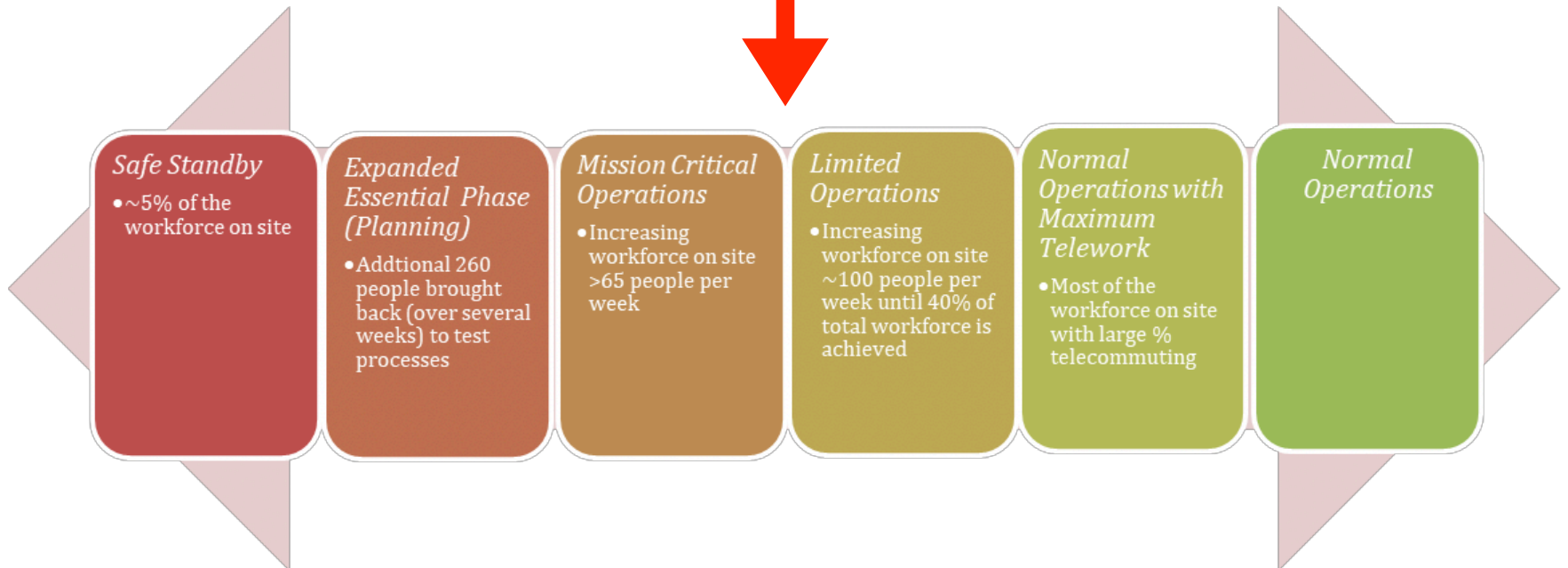

Current status of Return to Onsite Work Plan (2)

- Currently in the Mission Critical Operations phase
 - completed four rounds of ~65 people returning to work onsite
- Tomorrow we move to the Limited Operations phase
 - ~100 more people returning to work onsite
- Expect at least two more rounds of ~100 people returning during Limited Operations, two weeks apart (i.e. 7/9, 7/23)



PPD Return to Onsite Work Status

- Including Round 5, PPD will have a total of approximately 110 people on the essential personnel list, including associated users
 - Reports from those working onsite have generally been good
 - Learning lessons from early rounds to improve procedures
 - Thanks to all those coordinating onsite work
- We are making good progress in many important activities
 - Major progress on Mu2e tracker panels
 - g-2 pre-shutdown work complete and shutdown ramping up
 - Restarted work on all Cosmic and CMS projects at SiDet
 - ITA shielding block work complete. More ITA work starting in Round 5
 - Significant electronics work on WH14

PPD Return to Onsite Work - Look Ahead

- We can expect to add another 40-50 people in the next two rounds of Limited Operations
 - More than half the division will be back to working at least part-time onsite
 - Many of the remainder can perform their work remotely, but would still benefit from some time working onsite
- Looking ahead to Normal Operations with Maximum Telework and beyond, what would it look like for your departments to have 25% occupancy, or later 50% occupancy?
 - What work benefits from having these people back onsite?
 - Which 25% (or 50%) of your group is onsite at the same time?
