Recommendations from the Communications Policy Task Force

- Policy should be written from the perspective of default openness. List of topics that require advance notification should be accessible to all lab employees.
- No assumption that communication by staff is equivalent to an official statement by the lab.
- Media policy should be transparent regarding why communicating media interaction to Comms is preferable.
- Recognize that science communication is an important part of the Lab's mission.
- Aspects of the media policy pertaining to non-employee users should be clarified.

Hiring Process for the Head of PPD

Updates from our email discussion with Anadi

- The search will be a closed search. Information on applicants will be confidential and not shared outside the hiring committee
- Foreseen is an interaction between the search committee, responsible for making the recommendations to Nigel, and the Fermilab scientists via SAC.
 - This could be in form of a meeting between SAC and the search committee early in the process
 - The SAC can inform the search committee about the vision, needs, requests, concerns of the scientific personnel before starting the search.
 - How do we want to solicit this feedback from the scientific personnel?
 - How do we want to utilize our role as interface?



Library Move

- We have had email exchanges and meetings with Heath O'Connell, Martha Michels
- Key points:
 - 3rd floor being repurposed for the Theory Division
 - There will be a 15th floor Reading Room (old video room in NE corner)
 - Space for ~800 items (reusing waist-level shelving)
 - Taking everything that has circulated at least once in the past 4 years
 - 503 books, 80 print engineering standards, 150 print theses, ~1000 books currently out on loan
 - Librarian will be available during business hours to assist patrons
 - After-hours self-checkout will remain
 - Stefan is looking for options to store the remaining ~5800 books at the lab
