- Current room reservations:

 - Afternoon: 1-2 large talks, panel session, and ad-hoc working groups around campus
 - Evening: public events, social events
 - Day 9-10
 - Day and a half
 - Closeout, summary of where we are
 - P5 ramp up
- We have the main part of the rooms reserved
- Next things to buckle down
 - Reception: Currently the end of the day on Sunday (still to be fixed)
 - Dinner: close to the end of the day
- Structured to be about \$800/person for facilities, reception, conference services, and catering (lunch on plenary days, and coffee breaks).

Grant Applications

- DOE submission due in Dec
 - Target \$150k
 - Interpreters (captioners), rooms/facilities, student help
 - Parental support, childcare (Not include so far?)

 - Working with UW physics fiscal specialist for grant submission
- NSF submission due in Jan
 - Target \$50K
 - Cheaper registration fees for students and postdocs
