Requirements for access

- LArTF
 - Entry to building ground level. Keycard access:
 GERT and LArTF Hazard Awareness training.
 - Access below grade (platform/mezzanine and pit).
 Keys required:
 - O.D.H. training AND O.D.H. Medical qualification (examination by the Fermilab medical office)
 - Escorted access possible without ODH for one-time-only kinds of visits, with fully trained escort and notification. ODH escort ratio must be maintained.
 - Needed: notify me (number posted at key tree), keys, ODH monitor, hard hat.

MINOS

- Entry to service building. Keycard access: GERT
- Access to MINOS Underground. Keys required:
 - NuMI/MINOS Underground training, key through MCR
 - Hard hat, flashlight, closed-toe shoes







Reminders and Recommendations

- LArTF and MINOS card access lists are, in general, maintained manually and independently of training status. We usually request access from Key & ID once training is completed and if there's reason/permission for access. They are usually very quick and helpful about this. Communicate with me and Steve!
- MINOS Underground access keys are still held by the Main Control Room, though that may change in the future.
- Permanent Issue keys are limited, Steve and I are working to get more.
- Working on updating contact list signs. If any questions feel free to contact me and Steve. <u>cindyjoe@fnal.gov</u>, <u>Hahn@fnal.gov</u>
- Bathrooms and potable water are in MINOS and SBN-FD/ICARUS. NOvA and LArTF do not have bathrooms.
- Remember to wear correct safety masks indoors. Please refer to Chief Safety
 Officer's email of 1/21/22 and any subsequent updates. Level 2 medical masks or
 higher, KN-95 or N-95 recommended. Cloth masks no longer adequate (but can

- Other training classes may be needed: fall protection, ladder training, lift/aerial platform. Talk to me/Steve, Angela Aparicio (ND division safety officer)

Takeaway

- Training is important. Preferred: get your ITNA contact to add needed classes to your ITNA—that way you'll get reminders when training is due and it'll show up on your ITP.
- Access is not automatic on completion of training—please talk to us
- Please talk to us anyway so we can coordinate and help you!
- Bathroom, water in MINOS
- Access below grade in LArTF should be coordinated with Cindy.
- Steve is usually around physically during the day and I am usually around my phone and email
- Wear your masks, plan your trips/work, be safe
