 - jobsub_client submissions (on jobsub03) will be disabled
 - jobsub03 will complete all jobs in the queue and will be available until June 21st for retrieval of logs from those jobs

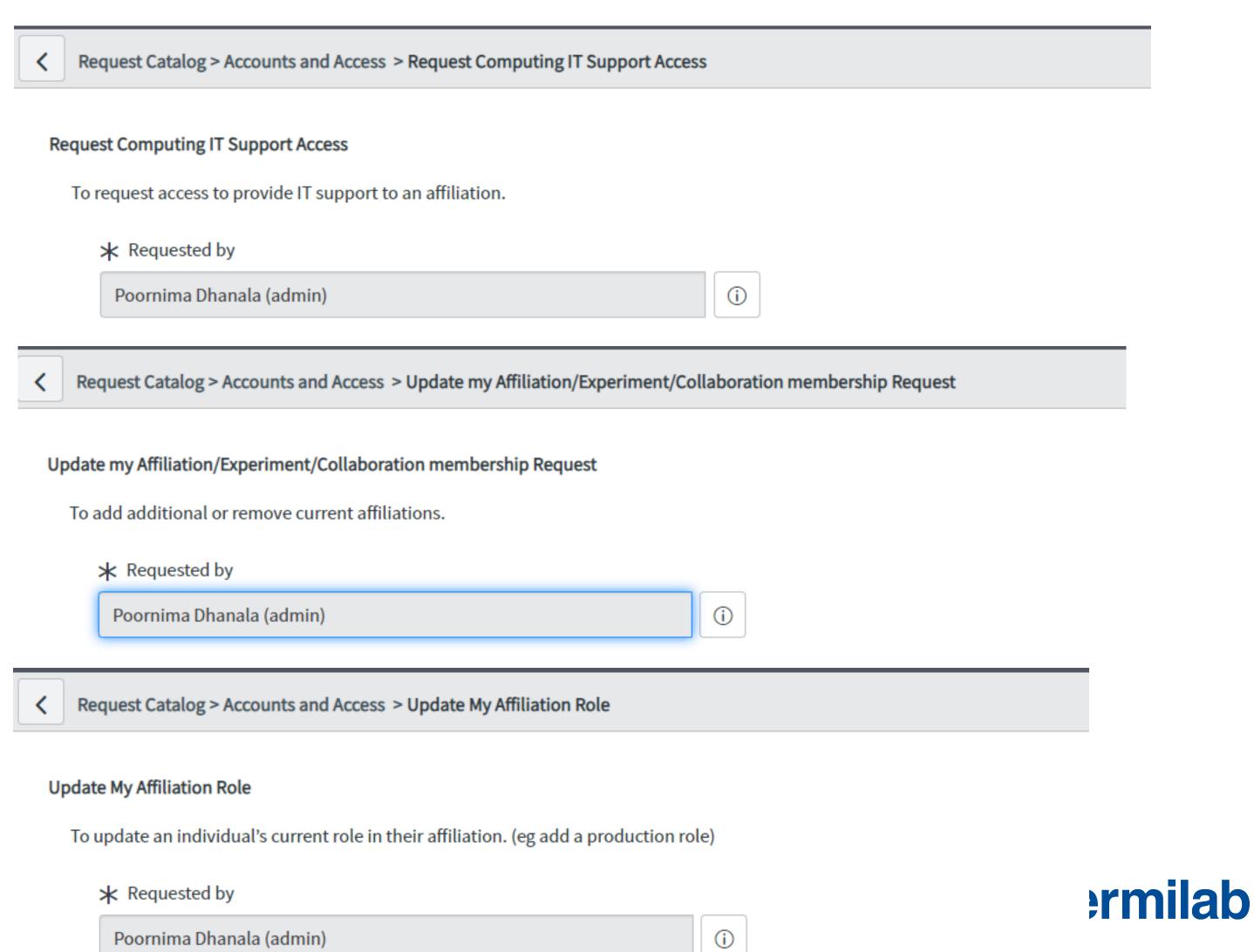

Changes in Docker Desktop Licensing

Docker Desktop licensing terms change

Dear colleagues,

Last year, Docker changed their licensing terms for Docker Desktop to require paid licenses for commercial users. Though at that time, Fermi Research Alliance, as a 501(c)(3), was not subject to these terms, Docker has recently modified their terms to require paid licenses for Docker Desktop used for government-funded research.

Effective immediately, if you are currently using Docker Desktop for personal use, you must create a new account and sign in using your personal e-mail, not your Fermilab account.
